<b>ACTIVITY &amp; CLASS</b>	Learning From Mistakes Class: 5-7 year olds
<b>DURATION</b>	30 minutes
<b>OBJECTIVES</b>	Main: Learn from Mistakes Secondary: to learn that making mistakes is acceptable as after getting extra knowledge they can change their answer or decision.
<b>MATERIALS</b>	A book on some commonly known topic, e.g. space, animals, human body, nature processes, cars (boys) or cooking (girls), etc., which is agreed in the class to be read by the teacher.  Notes for teacher to write down the answers class is giving
<b>LEARNING ACTIVITY METHOD</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Teacher prepares set of 3 questions (factual type) on topics that will be covered during the reading and ask them to the class BEFORE reading (open questions, asked and answered orally);</li> <li>• Class one by one answers to the questions, teacher writes down the answers;</li> <li>• After the class has answered the questions, teacher reads the book;</li> <li>• After the reading the book teacher asks the class the same questions and emphasizes that if anyone needs, they are allowed to change their mind and answer differently.</li> <li>• After the class answers the questions, teacher starts a discussion about questions, answers and how important it is</li> </ul>

<b>TEACHER PREPARATION</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Teacher should prepare (agree with kids before) a book that will be read during the class;</li><li>• Teacher should prepare 3 questions (factual type) whose answers are in the text that will be read</li></ul>
<b>TEACHER'S EVALUATION</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Has the activity helped kids to conduct critical thinking?</li><li>• Has this activity helped kids to change their mind if they understand that they were wrong at some point?</li><li>• Has this activity helped kids not to be upset if they understand that they were wrong but could change their mind?</li></ul>
